FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JANUARY 28, 2018

Preach the Gospel with your life!

Every Christian is called to preach the Gospel with their life. You can preach by example. You can also preach by words. And you must understand that every Christian is called; there is no exception to being an apostle of Christ. Everyone is called; to deny this is to deny the whole idea of our baptism.

We like to hide behind the fact that we are unlettered or we are not equipped. These are sort of smoke screens which shout very loudly: "I don't want to preach because I don't want to practice." We have our roots in Christ and he will show you what he wants you to do in the service of humanity.

Christ knew that he was himself the Good News; therefore we look at him. He did not establish a kingdom on earth. He didn't do what we call social or political justice; he was not involved directly in those things.

But he knew that he was the Good News. How does this apply directly to us? Before we can do any social action, political action, healing action, corporal or spiritual works of mercy, we have to be Jesus Christ. You have to be the Glad News!

To preach the Glad News is to be like Jesus Christ! I don't think that we must do anything in particular to be like Jesus Christ. I really don't. I think we just must love! Do we pray to be changed into love?

The true revolution that Christ wants to make at all times, in all ages of history, is the revolution of example. To preach the Gospel one must live it. Naturally, none of us can live it to the hilt, barring a few saints maybe, but one must try. I think that what matters is not speech, it is being. One has to just be before God, before one can do something for God and man. I have to connect myself with God first, then I can connect with people. Otherwise my connection with man is humanitarian or what have you, but it certainly has nothing to do with the Christian religion.

I think that we are coming, in our time and age, closer and closer to the reality. I think the revolution of Christ is done in little spots that are utterly unimportant to the big world, utterly unsung and unheard of by the majority that 'matters,' the politicians and so on. I think it is accomplished by those who group themselves around Christ, with a humble desire to just live his life out, to be icons of Christ, to bring other people to him.

The desire of an apostle is only one: to bring other people to Christ; and the only way to bring other people to him is to love them. And out of that love come compassion, tenderness, understanding, hospitality of the heart as well as of the house, acceptance of people as they are, and trusting the untrustworthy.

All these things flow from love, and love flows from faith. Faith is the cradle, and from it, love and hope and all the fruits of love and hope should come forth from my heart to your heart. And once I see in your eyes tenderness, compassion, love, understanding, trust, then the icon of Christ that is in your face becomes alive. You vanish and he appears. That is being an apostle.

CANADA SUMMER IOBS PROGRAM

Canada Summer Jobs Program - Reach Out to Your Member of Parliament

The federal government has introduced new requirements for employers applying for the Canada Summer Jobs grant. To be eligible for funding, employers must attest that both the job and the organization's core mandate respect certain "values" as determined by the federal government including the government's position on abortion, sexual orientation and gender identity or expression. Organizations unable or unwilling to make this attestation in whole or in part will be deemed ineligible for the grant. This requirement is clearly unjust.

Many Catholic organizations throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and many other faiths involved in charitable activity at soup kitchens, shelters, refugee welcome centres or summer camps are impacted by this decision. ST. BLAISE - FEAST DAY: FEBRUARY 3RD

Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written of 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise."

Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing

In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet.

Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.
