

We will celebrate the Solemnity of St Joseph, Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Monday, March 19th with a traditional St Joseph's Table following the 12.05 pm Mass.

St. Joseph is the principal patron of Canada, but is also



considered to be the patron saint of Sicily. The custom of the St. Joseph's Table is still celebrated in many Italian communities. According to legend, there was a famine in Sicily during the Middle Ages, caused by a severe drought. People prayed for St Joseph to bring them rain, and when the rain came, they prepared a feast to thank their patron saint.

A St. Joseph's Table is usually decorated with flowers and candles

and offers a variety of baked goods, cakes and cookies, including traditional cream-filled pastries called zeppole.

The Ministry of Maturing Adults invites you to join us to celebrate St Joseph with fellowship, coffee and treats.

Qesus said "Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour."



~ John 12:24-26 ~

Reflection: Not every wheat grain will germinate. Without the right conditions, a grain will lie dormant and never bear fruit. The grain needs sun, rain, nutrients before it can begin to grow. Is my faith life dormant? Or am I nourishing it so that it will yield an abundant harvest?

What needs to die in me so that I may live more fully? Pray for the grace to see what I have to do and for the grace to do it.

God can use us to affect the lives of many people for good. But for this we need to be following Jesus, not following our own whims and preferences. We are to surrender our lives and ask the question 'Lord, what do you want me to do with my life today'?

Lord, grace me with the gift of letting go of all that I cling to. May I not block your Spirit moving in me. Work through me so that like Mary, I may carry you to all those whose lives I touch.

It will not do for the grain of wheat just to die in order to produce fruit. It must 'fall into the earth'. We will achieve nothing on our own. We need the nourishment which Jesus provides, for he is our life.

Jesus says here that 'serving' and 'following' him are the same thing. It is not for us to choose how or where to serve him. We must follow first and let him lead us to where he wants us to serve. A disciple cannot say, 'I did it my way!'


The image that Jesus presents is simple yet strong. He does not speak of 'passing away' or 'falling asleep' but of death and loss. Faith in Jesus strengthens me to look beyond death to the beginning of new life.

Jesus speaks to me as friend and calls me into his family as he invites me to remain ready to follow and to serve.

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The crucifixion involved a sinless human being united to the person of the Divine Son who eternally returns all that he is to the Father in love. He does this right here in

our history. Nothing will ever be the same again. As we walk along Jesus' journey of suffering, we begin to see: we get spiritual clues to total self-giving in love from the one who has gone before us. Catholicism expresses that infinite selfless love of God.

Moreover, walking alongside this miracle of real love as it happens is Mary, Jesus' Mother, who has to watch her son being tormented to death.
