REMEMBERING THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

 \mathcal{D} uring the entire month of November, a book of remembrance will be on display at the front of the Church sanctuary. All are invited to record the names of the deceased you wish to remember.

"A PRIEST FOREVER"

 \mathcal{D} uring the Rite of Baptism, the newly baptized person is anointed with the Sacred Chrism, and the celebrant says:

God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.

I always point out that the chrism is the same oil that is used at the ordination of a priest, when the bishop pours it generously on the hands of the newly ordained, to consecrate



them to the work of sacred ministry.

This baptismal anointing serves to remind us that all of the baptized are called to a type of priesthood. This "common" or "universal" priesthood is really the priesthood of Christ who alone is the true priest, in whose priesthood all the members of His Body are called to participate (CCC 1141).

Christ, high priest and unique mediator, has made of the Church "a kingdom, priests for his God and Father." The whole community of believers is, as such, priestly. The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to his own vocation, in Christ's mission as priest, prophet, and king. Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation the faithful are "consecrated to be . . . a holy priesthood" (CCC 1546).

This past week, I celebrated the 10th anniversary of my ordination to the ministerial priesthood, and I continue to give thanks every day for this wonderful gift that has been given to me to serve the Church.

And so, in that same spirit, I urge you all to reflect on the nature of your own baptismal vocation. How is God calling

you to share the many gifts He has given you—in a way that will benefit the faith community to which you belong?

In the coming year, the Archdiocese will be encouraging a better understanding of stewardship as a form of spirituality. Please consider the abundance of time, treasure and talent that God has bestowed upon you, and in your thankfulness for all your blessings, consider how you are called to respond to God's generosity.

Who is a Christian steward? One who

- receives God's gifts gratefully,
- cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner,
- *shares them in love and justice with others*
- and returns them with increase to the Lord.
