# STATIONS OF THE CROSS & MASS EVERY FRIDAY DURING LENT AT 6:30 PM

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. They involve Jesus enduring suffering, insults, moments of support, and relay the intense sacrifice that we believe Jesus undertook for human salvation

The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.



# Altar Display

 $\mathcal{O}$ f you have missed Mass at our Parish last week, you may be wondering what is up with the sand and other things under the altar. Well as Father Peter explained, these items represent the temptation of Jesus during his 40 days in the desert.

The sand and the cactus represent the desert. The stone depicts the first temptation when the devil says to Jesus, "If you are the Son of God, change the rock into a loaf of *bread*". The globe signifies the second time when the



devil takes Jesus and shows him all the kingdoms of the world and tells him they can be his if he worships the devil. And the tall metal cone represents the pinnacle of the temple when the devil takes Jesus up to the top and says. "If you are truly the Son of God throw yourself down, as it has been written He will command his angels to protect you".

Over the course of the Lenten season, take time to

reflect on the many ways we are tempted. How strong is your resolve, and your faith?
