Reflection

The gospel highlights that we can miss the master of the house because we do not know when he is coming. We know when the 'master of the house' is coming and still we can miss him! Christmas can pass by many of us and we have little time for the main event and people of the



mystery. Or we can hit it in spots. Christmas itself is so busy and often with very worthwhile events for the family. So, the four weeks we begin today can ensure we don't miss it.

We are all 'the work of

your hand' as the first reading (Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1. 3) reminds us. God is all the time at work, creating us. It's not that he made us, and then left us. It's not love at a distance. God is present within us and without. Christmas will be the time of recalling this.

An Understanding of the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy days of Obligation during the time of the COVID-19 pandemic

The dispensation announced by Cardinal Collins on June 10, 2020, regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and holydays of obligation by parishioners in the Archdiocese of Toronto during the time of the COVID-19 pandemic, is not a blanket dispensation[1], but one that applies when the faithful encounter certain life circumstances which physically or morally impede them from attending

Physical impediments preventing the faithful from attending Mass during the COVID-19 pandemic include: -closure of one's parish church or reduction of number of Masses on Sunday or holy days of obligation due to COVID-19 conditions:

- -closure of all parishes in an area, Region or the Archdiocese due to COVID-19 conditions;
- -being ill or taking care of someone who is ill, and being home-bound or hospital-bound;
- -feeling symptomatic for the COVID-19 virus;
- -needing to self-isolate due to a COVID-19 related contact;
- -attempting to register for Mass, but the registration is full; -arriving at a parish and being told that the church is at

Moral impediments preventing the faithful from attending Mass during the COVID-19 pandemic include:

- -being of a certain age and/or having an underlying health condition and feeling vulnerable to the virus because of known and serious consequences, despite an otherwise healthy disposition;
- -having a genuine grave fear of the COVID-19 virus and not desiring to be at any place where people gather.

The above characteristics are not exhaustive, but exemplary of conditions that would qualify for the dispensation.

[1] CIC Canon 90 §1 states in part: "One is not to be dispensed from an ecclesiastical law without a just and reasonable cause, after taking into account the circumstances of the case and the gravity of the law from which dispensation is given [...]"


