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## Building Families on Prayer The Finding of Jesus in the Temple Luke 2:41-52

The Holy Family went through many of the same experiences that all parents and children experience today. They too would have had moments of great joy and difficult trials as well as many moments of simple ordinary life. Jesus, Mary and Joseph are the perfect example of how families should live in holiness and stewardship. Let us take some time today, on this Feast of the Holy Family, to seek ways to imitate them.

The Gospel from Luke recounts how "every year the parents of Jesus went to Jerusalem for the festival of the



Passover." Mary and Joseph took their faith very seriously and sought to pass on their beliefs to their child. They realized that while there are many important things that a child needs to grow, their relationship with God should be their first priority. They would have also taken Jesus to the synagogue and taught him how to pray and read the scriptures. We can take their example to

heart by striving to make our

faith the highest priority in our families as well. We can strive to be great parental stewards just like Mary and Joseph. For starters, we should make attending Sunday Mass the most important aspect of our week. We can supplement this by regularly going as a family for times of Confession and trying to pray together at home.

One beautiful practice we can try to adopt is praying the Rosary together. If an entire rosary together is too difficult due to everyone's schedules, perhaps we can pray just one decade together. Let us commit to making our families beautiful and holy just like that blessed family from Nazareth.

### CHRISTMAS-Q+A

#### Q. When does Christmas officially end?

**A.** The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Mass on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

# *Q.* What is the Octave of Christmas - December 25 – January 1 (inclusive)?

**A.** An octave extends the celebration of a feast or solemnity for eight days. During the Octave of Christmas, for example, all the readings and prayers during the celebration of Mass are related to the birth of Christ. Octave celebrations got their start in the Church way back in the fourth century. The "octave day" (eighth day) of Christmas is January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God—a holy day on which all Catholics are obliged to celebrate Mass.

# Q. Explain the Twelve Days of Christmas

(*Christmastide*) *December 26 – January 6 (or Epiphany*) A. Traditionally, the twelve days of Christmas begin on December 26 and end on January 6, the traditional date of Epiphany. Epiphany means "manifestation" or "appearance." So while the baptism of Christ marks the beginning of his public ministry, it is also part of his "manifestation" or "appearance"—one of the events signaling that God has broken into human history in a unique way.

#### Q. Is every day Christmas for Catholics?

**A.** For Catholics, every day is, in the most basic sense, Christmas. That's because every day, the Word becomes flesh in the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist; and through the sacraments, the people of God become of the Body of Christ in the world. Just as Mary's "yes" made her an instrument of God's incarnation in the world, by our "yes," we too birth the Son of God into the world.

# Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God January 1<sup>st</sup>



Through this Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, the Church tells us that we should not be afraid, that we should prepare ourselves for the beginning of the New Year by asking Our Lord and our Most Beloved Mother, the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, to come to our aid.

We should ask her, not just today – although on this solemnity is an especially important occasion for doing so – but always, to help us to
