

Peace Be with You

The life of the Christian disciple is one that should be filled with great peace. However, peace does not mean the absence of difficulties or trials. Rather, true peace is living in joy despite the turbulences we may experience. We're reminded in the Gospel that we can only receive this peace from Jesus. He tells us, "*Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives*".



How does the world give peace? The world tells us that if we have lots of money in the bank, the fancy car, the extravagant house and the perfect looks, then we will be at peace. It promotes peace as something that is achieved through exterior possessions or circumstances. However, what does the world offer us when difficulties arise? How does the world teach peace in the midst of tough financial situations or an unfavourable medical diagnoses? This is where the peace of Christ triumphs.

We can achieve a sense of interior peace despite the exterior sufferings when we fix our minds on things that are heavenly. We can always draw great strength from realizing our identity as beloved children of God. God loves us. This reality alone has the profound effect of easing the greatest of crosses. St. Teresa of Avila says, "*Let nothing perturb you, nothing frighten you. All things pass. God does not change. Patience achieves everything*". God is always faithful towards us. The next time we're in a moment that threatens to rob us of our peace, let us take a deep breath, call to mind the smiling gaze of Christ towards us, and pray, "*Jesus I love you*".

Summary

Jesus tell us "*Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives*." The world promotes peace as something that is achieved through exterior possessions or circumstances yet it offers no remedy for times of great trial. On the other hand, with Jesus, the next time we're in a moment that threatens to rob us of our peace, let us take a deep breath, call to mind the smiling gaze of Christ towards us, and pray, "*Jesus I love you*".

VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Feast day: May 31, 2025

What is the Visitation story?

Visitation, the visit, described in the Gospel According to Luke (1:39–56), made by the Virgin Mary, pregnant with Jesus, to her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant with St. John the Baptist. At the sound of Mary's greeting, the Elizabeth felt her baby leap in her womb.



What are the four values that Mary manifested in the story of the Visitation?

Fraternal Charity by Mary. Obedience of Mary. Gratitude by Mary. Justice & Praise by Elizabeth.

What did Mary say at the Visitation?

Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior.

What mystery is the Visitation of Mary?

The Second Joyful Mystery is The Visitation. Mary goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth to tell her how happy she is that she is going to have a baby. Elizabeth's baby is John the Baptist.

What can we learn from the Visitation of Mary?

By her visit to Elizabeth, Mary reminds us that mission begins not in actions and words, but by bearing Christ to others within ourselves as living tabernacles. Mary testifies to the primary importance of simply carrying Jesus even before there are words or deeds to show him and explain him.

What is the significance of the Visitation of Mary?

The Visitation: Reminding of Us of Our Joy in Christ.

Frequently Asked Questions on Plenary Indulgences during the JUBILEE YEAR *continued ...*

What are the specifications to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence by practising works of mercy?

One may participate in either a popular mission, spiritual exercises, formation activities on the documents of Vatican II and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, or by following the usual spiritual, sacramental and prayer conditions, the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, which are: feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; clothe the naked; welcome the stranger; heal the sick; visit the imprisoned; bury the dead; counsel the doubtful; instruct the ignorant; admonish sinners; comfort the afflicted; forgive offenses; bear patiently those who do us ill; pray for the living and the dead.

What are the specifications for penance?

- Rediscover the penitential nature of Friday;
- Abstain from futile distractions and superfluous consumption;
- Donate a proportionate sum of money to the poor;
- Support works of a religious or social nature (e.g. defense and protection of life);
- Support efforts for quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the lonely, elderly and migrants;
- Dedicate free time to voluntary activities in the community.
